Due to COVID-19 the show committee plans to implement social distancing policies at the shows and operate under a LIMITED SHOW OFFICE to help protect exhibitors, staff, and officials.

Some of these policies will include:

- Anyone who exhibits COVID-19 symptoms, has tested positive for COVID-19 within last two weeks, or *has
 been in contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 within the last two weeks cannot enter
 the competition grounds. *Exception: Healthcare personnel who have treated patients using appropriate
 medical grade PPE during the course of performing professional duties are exempted from this restriction.
- Staff, officials, and volunteers will have their temperatures taken upon arrival each morning.
- Participants and their support crew (rider, trainer, groom) are required to self-monitor their temperature once daily prior to entering the competition grounds.
- All participants, including licensed officials and volunteers, must provide emergency contact information and execute an updated Waiver and Release of Liability, Assumption of Risk and Indemnity Agreement required by USEF, as a condition of participation.
- Anyone with a temperature of 100.4° F (38° C) or higher may not enter the facility.
- All attendees are required to social distance by a minimum of six feet and wear a face mask/covering at all times unless on a horse.
- A staff member will be patrolling the barn areas to remind people to wear masks and social distance.
- A face mask or face covering is required for all staff, officials, volunteers, service providers, and participants at any time while on the grounds and when not mounted on a horse. Competitors and their support crew are required to provide their own masks.
- All entries must be perfect to facilitate pick up outside show office. Limited office visits will be permitted.
- Scratches and rider/horse changes will be communicated via email and/or phone with the show office.
- Issues that need staff or official's attention will be initiated by a phone call to the office and, if needed, the appropriate staff or officials will address the item at the exhibitor's stabling area.
- Competitors are encouraged to limit their time inside indoor buildings outside of their ride times and time to properly attend to their horses.
- Competitors may not report to their warm up area more than one hour before their ride time.
- The number of horses in each warm up area will be limited.
- Spectators will not be permitted. Wristbands will only be issued to rider, trainer, groom and owner.
- The Competition Organizer has the authority under GR 702.1 and GR914 to remove from the facility any
 person who does not comply with the regulations and requirements in effect at the competition.

For other classes, if you do not have a Horse ID or Registration, you will be required to fill out either a Horse ID (\$35 fee) or a Horse Recording (\$115 fee) before being allowed to compete
- +USDF membership information for EACH rider and owner is required on your entry form (except for those competing **only** in Introductory &/or Opportunity classes). Please send copies of your USDF non-member ID (NID) or USDF membership cards. If you do not have a USDF membership card you will required to pay a \$35 nonmember fee.

Competition Arenas open for schooling 5 p.m.-9 p.m. Friday & after last Saturday class until 9:00 p.m. Friday. Warm-up Arenas and Lunging Arena available throughout shows and until 9:00 p.m. Friday & Saturday.

STABLING

Permanent box stalls10'x10' or larger with doors on grounds. \$65.00 per stall per day (\$130 for both days). Shavings: pre-order & prepay at \$10/bag. Competitors may arrive at 5 p.m. Friday. If only showing Sunday, may arrive 6 p.m. Saturday. Send stabling fees with your entry form. Three wash racks w/hot-cold water available. Early arrival either day MUST BE pre-approved (email: equestrian@houghton.edu) and pay \$50 early arrival fee; Pre-approved early arrival stalls will be ready. Early arrivals WITHOUT pre-approval must pay a \$100 early arrival fee & wait for a stall to be readied.

A separate \$25 stall cleaning check to Houghton College is required—check will be returned or shredded if stall is inspected & clean prior to leaving the show premises.

MANAGEMENT NOTES

Management reserves right to combine or cancel classes, or alter the show ring size if entries warrant. Only horses entered in the competition are permitted on grounds, due to insurance regulations.

From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, ANYONE mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds, including non-competing riders and handlers must wear PROTECTIVE HEAD GEAR at all times when mounted (USEF rule DR1210.6, see rulebook for full details)

SMOKING is not permitted on the premises.

Dogs are not permitted to be loose on competition grounds and must be held on a leash or otherwise restrained. Individuals must not lead dogs on a leash while mounted. Dog owners are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from their dogs' behaviors. Dog owners failing to comply with this rule will be issued a Yellow warning card and may be subject to penalty under Chapters 6 and 7. (GR1301.6) No other pets or livestock other than horses and mules allowed on grounds.

OFFICE INFORMATION

Office Hours-The show office and stabling will open at 4:00 Friday of competition weekend. During the show, the show office will be open one hour before the first ride until one hour after the last ride.

Ride Times-Provisional times will be available at www.WNYDA.org. Management reserves the right to change the time schedule after tentative times have been posted. It is the responsibility of the rider to inform the management of any time conflicts as soon as possible after receiving the schedule. Official times will be available at noon the day before each show. Check online or the official posting of ride times at the office for ride times. This show follows USEF GR830 with regard to rescheduled ride times. Any changes after closing date initiated by rider or owner will incur a \$20 per change fee.

Schedule-Classes may not necessarily be run in the order listed in the class lists.

Schooling will begin at 5:00 Friday of show weekend. All competitors must have their current issued bridle number before riding. Schooling on Friday will continue until dusk. Saturday schooling will be available after the show until dusk.

<u>Hand-walking</u> of unmounted horses is allowed around the exterior of the competition rings from sunrise until 30 minutes prior to the first ride. No mounted horses allowed.

<u>Leaving the Competition</u>-No exhibitor may withdraw horses from a licensed show after it has commenced or remove them from the show grounds without permission of the show secretary.

Bridle numbers-All horses must always wear current issued bridle numbers when out of stall.

Anyone mounting, getting on, riding or trying a horse at the facility during the weekend of the show (including warmup day) must sign a show release form in the show office.

Please contact show secretary for any questions regarding entering competition/entry forms.

<u>Freestyles/Music</u>: Music for all freestyles on CD in WAV format must be given to the show office upon arrival. Sound checks will be conducted Thursday late afternoon/early evening. Other times must be arranged with show management. The times for sound checks will be posted in the show office. Competitors are responsible to picking up their music before the end of the show. Music left will not be mailed. DR129.9

Except for USEF/USDF Championship classes and for FEI Pony Riders, FEI Junior, FEI Young Rider and FEI Para-Equestrian Freestyles, in order to enter a freestyle class at any level, a horse/rider combination must have received a minimum score of 63% for Training through Fourth levels and 60% for FEI levels in the highest test of the declared freestyle level or any test of a higher level at a USEF/USDF licensed Dressage Competition or FEI recognized Dressage Competition or "open" Dressage class (i.e. open to all breeds) at a Federation Licensed Competition held prior to the competition where the horse/rider combination is entered to ride a freestyle class. A photocopy of the test verifying eligibility, or copy of the USDF score verification, must be submitted with the entry for a freestyle class. BOD 7/8/19 Effective 12/1/19

- Submit two CDs of your music clearly labeled with your name, horse's name, bridle number, and freestyle level.
- Be present for your sound check.
- Know the rules for the level you are riding. This includes forbidden and allowed movements for your level.

CLASS LIMITATIONS, OPPORTUNITY, & EQUITATION CLASSES:

Consecutive Levels-Horses may enter no more than two consecutive levels, Freestyle levels included, at any one competition. Refer to DR119.2 for levels chart.

Classes per Day-Horses are limited to a maximum of three Dressage rides per day at Fourth Level and below or two Dressage rides per day above Fourth Level. Horses competing at both Fourth Level and Prix St. Georges, or their equivalents, are limited to two Dressage rides per day. Dressage Seat Equitation, Quadrille, Pas de Deux and Materiale classes are excluded from the maximum limit of rides per day and horses in these classes may compete at any level for which they are otherwise eligible during the same competition.

Opportunity Classes-Opportunity classes are intended for entry level riders. Horses and riders entered only in "Opportunity" classes are exempt from USEF and USDF membership requirements and do not have to pay nonmember (show pass) or HID fees. Federation and drug fees do not apply. Horses entered only in these classes are still subject to and must comply with the Drugs and Medication rules and are subject to drug testing. Riders and/or horses entered in "opportunity" classes may not cross-enter in other recognized classes at the show. Participants must abide by all USEF regulations pertaining to attire, tack, and equipment for the recognized show. DR120.5 Riders in Opportunity classes in Level 2 and Level 3 Competitions, may compete wearing breeches and shirts of any color as permitted in DR120.8. Jackets or vests of any type are allowed but not required and neckwear may be worn only if the rider chooses to compete in a riding jacket. Boots and protective headgear are required as specified in DR120.1-6. USEF rule GR821 for additional information on opportunity classes.

Dressage Seat Medal Program-The USEF/USDF Dressage Seat Medal Program, for riders ages 18 and under, celebrates excellence in equitation and strives to develop a solid foundation for future success in the dressage arena. Riders wishing to qualify for the USEF Dressage Seat Medal Finals must compete in the USDF Dressage Seat Medal Semi-Finals held at the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Championships. To qualify for the USDF Dressage Seat Medal Semi-Finals, a competitor must earn a qualifying score of 70% or above in any eligible Dressage Seat Equitation class (except walk/trot) held at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized dressage competition during the qualifying period or by qualifying for the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Championships. The top two placing riders in the Semi-Finals are automatically invited to the Finals.

USDF Regional Adult Amateur Equitation Program-Rider must be an Adult Amateur (age 22 and up) and have a USDF participating membership at the time the qualifying score is earned. Horse must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration when the qualifying score is earned. To be eligible for the USDF Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class, rider must have earned a score of 70% or higher in any dressage seat equitation class within the qualifying period or qualify to compete in any regional dressage championship class (excluding freestyles.)

Regional Adult Amateur Equitation Program

The USDF Regional Adult Amateur Equitation Program recognizes adult amateurs competing in equitation and promotes correct seat, position, and use of the aids in dressage. An Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class presented by Big Dee's Tack and Vet Supply will be held in conjunction with each of the nine USDF Regional Dressage Championship competitions, providing adult amateurs with additional opportunity for recognition.

Adult amateurs wishing to qualify to compete in an Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final may do so by meeting the following requirements.

Qualifying Requirements

To be eligible for the USDF Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class, rider must have

- a) Earned a score of 70% or higher in any dressage seat equitation class (except walk/trot) at a USEF-licensed/USDFrecognized Dressage competition within the qualifying period of the applicable regional championship.
- Qualified to compete in any regional dressage championship class (excluding freestyles).

Membership Requirements

- Rider must have a USDF Participating Membership at the time the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the
- Rider must be an adult amateur, in accordance with GR1306 of the USEF rules, and be designated with USEF as an adult amateur when the score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class
- Owner must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership when the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class
- Horse must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration when the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional

USEF & USDF - GENERAL REGULATIONS and FEES FOR RECOGNIZED SHOWS

Applicable USEF and USDF information must be provided for each horse, rider, owner, trainer, and coach. Entries must include current membership or identification numbers and a copy of ALL USEF and USDF cards. If not included, entry will be considered incomplete and will be subject to the fee(s) and/or completion of applications listed below. Entries must contain all three/four mandatory original signatures for (1) Rider, (2) Owner, (3) Trainer, and if applicable (4) Coach. The word "same" will be rejected. If you do not have a formal trainer on the show grounds, the rider must sign as trainer. If the rider is under 18 years old, a parent/guardian must sign entry and must sign as trainer if no trainer is present. If you do not have a coach on the grounds, no signature is required for coach. Noncompeting horses and riders are not subject to any USEF or USDF fees. Competition management urges all competitors to complete membership and/or identification requirements with USEF and USDF in advance of entering any recognized competition.

ATTENTION COMPETITORS

Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with correct applicable numbers (USDF and USEF) for horse, owner, rider, and trainer, before the day(s) of the competition.

The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national awards.

USEF REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL COMPETING ENTRIES:

- * Horse must be USEF annual or life recorded or have USEF HID (Horse Identification Number) or a USDF HID known to USEF
- * RIDER, OWNER, TRAINER, (COACH) must have a USEF Life Membership or USEF Annual Membership or be a USEF Junior Member
- * RIDER, OWNER, TRAINER, (coach) without USEF membership must pay the USEF non-member show pass fee
- * Parent/guardian signing for junior rider/owner/trainer is exempt from USEF membership requirements.
- * NOTE: Entries competing only in USDF Introductory or USDF Pas de Deux or USDF Quadrille or Opportunity classes are exempt from USEF membership/identification requirements and non-member fees.

Reminder:

All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. 

USDF Statement on Animal Welfare

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of over 100 independent organizations throughout the United States with a member-ship of nearly 30,000 members, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.

Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.

The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.

"EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT FEDERATION RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH."

US EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION rules are in force from the moment show management allows access to the show grounds. This includes conduct, correct saddlery and equipment, and attire.

USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT DR901.9

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$45 Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR222) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

MOTORIZED VEHICLE RULE In accordance with GR1301.7:

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal quardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

<u>Sharps Containers</u>-Competition management shall place a minimum of one sharps container per competition barn for the disposal of needles and other disposable sharp instruments. It is competition management's responsibility to replace such containers when full and dispose of them properly. Competition management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments. Please do not use garbage cans for this material. If local law has different requirements, local law will prevail.

Protective Headgear Rule DR120.6 Current USEF helmet policy will be strictly enforced.

From NW (Buffalo, NY area, CANADA): Follow route 400 S to end. Continue S on route 16 through small towns of South Wales, Holland, and Chaffee. In Yorkshire, turn left at traffic light on route 39 E. Follow route 39 E for a little over 3 miles into small town of Arcade. Just after crossing RR tracks in Arcade, turn left at traffic light at T-intersection on route 98 S. Follow route 98 S to route 243. Bear left on route 243 (do NOT turn right on route 98!). Follow route 243 to end at T-intersection with blinking light in Caneadea.

Turn left at blinking light on route 19 N. Go 3 miles on route 19 N. At south edge of Houghton, just after 35 MPH sign, turn left up Tucker Hill Road (sign for "Houghton College Equestrian Center" is on the corner). Go 0.9 mile up Tucker Hill Road. Turn right on School Farm Road (sign for "Houghton College Equestrian Center is on the corner). Bear right on driveway at end of pavement.

From NE (Rochester, NY area): Follow route 390 S to exit for Mt. Morris. At bottom of exit ramp, turn left on route 408. Follow route 408 through Mt. Morris (left at light at top of hill, go ½ block, right at next light, then about 11 miles) to town of Nunda. At 4-way stop intersection in Nunda, turn right on route 436 W. Follow route 436 W to Portageville where it crosses a bridge over the Genesee River, turns right, and ends at T-intersection on route 19-A. Turn left on route 19-A S. Follow route 19-A S to end at blinker light in small town of Fillmore. Continue straight through intersection on route 19 S for 4 miles to Houghton. Drive through Houghton to south edge of town (about 0.5 mile). Turn right up Tucker Hill Road (sign for "Houghton College Equestrian Center on corner). Go 0.9 mile up Tucker Hill Road and turn right on School Farm Road (another sign for "Houghton College Equestrian Center" is on the corner). Bear right on driveway at end of pavement.

From the South: Drive north to route I-86. Follow I-86 to exit 30 (Houghton is one of the towns on the green exit sign). Turn N on route 19. Follow route 19 N to south edge of Houghton (about 14 miles). Turn left up Tucker Hill Road (sign for "Houghton College Equestrian Center" is on the corner). Go 0.9 mile up Tucker Hill Road. Turn right on School Farm Road (another sign for "Houghton College Equestrian Center" is on the corner). Bear right on driveway at end of pavement.

Once you arrive at Houghton College Equestrian Center, stop by the Welcome Center on the north (driveway) end of the large indoor arena. Inside the Welcome Center you can pick up your competitor packet and stall assignments. You can then drive to park briefly near your stall to unload your horse(s) and gear, then drive to the large gravel parking lot to leave your rig. The grounds are set up so that you can always drive forward to get from one spot to the next, with NO backing needed. ©



<u>USDF Membership Benefits:</u> USDF is dedicated to education, the recognition of achievement, and promotion of dressage. For details on member benefits, including educational programs, awards, and other opportunities, refer to the *USDF Member Guide* or the USDF website at www.usdf.org.

This competition is recognized by USDF for 2021

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions:

Owners and riders, including foreign riders

and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those
 sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at
 Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are
 exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot,
 academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM
 identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$90), 5-years (\$360), or life (\$1,800). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$72). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards Program and the USDF Regional Schooling Show Awards Program. **Business Membership (BM):** A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$240) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$35 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$35). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded, but will NOT be counted towards Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$80. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$115) is eligible for Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

How to Join USDF

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

- On the USDF website: www.usdf.org. You can submit the application online or download the form and fax or mail it to the USDF office.
- In the show office at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions classified by USEF as Dressage Competitions, and Regular Competitions which are open to all breeds.

The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date accepted by the competition secretary, provided the application is signed and dated by the competition secretary, member, and/or horse owner on that same day.



2021 Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships

A single Regional Dressage Championship program organized by the United States Dressage Federation (USDF), and recognized by the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF), will be held in each of the nine USDF regions. In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships if an official request from a Group Member Organization (GMO) is received by April 1 of the prior year. The Regional Championship Program Rules can be found on the USDF website at www.usdf.org. Please refer to the 2021 USDF Member Guide for the comprehensive list of rules and requirements for this program.

Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying and Championships

All memberships and registrations/recordings must be correct and current at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

Rider:

- Must have a USDF Participating* Membership (PM).
- Must have a USEF membership (Junior Active, Senior Active, or Life).

Horse:

- Must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR).
- Must have a USEF (Annual or Lifetime) Horse recording.
- USDF horse registration and USEF horse recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s). A horse is not required to have breed registry papers.

Owner:

- Must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership and a USEF membership (Junior Active, Senior Active, Life, or Recorded Farm (with Active Farm Owner)). If the horse has more than one owner, at least one owner must have both active USEF membership and active USDF Participating or Business Membership and must be the owner of record with USEF and USDF. For a business or farm to be the valid owner under this requirement, it must be listed as an owner of the horse with both USEF and USDF.
- * PMs are USDF members who join USDF directly. USDF Group Members (GM) are ineligible.

ODEN

Minimum Qualifying Scores: One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for Training Level through Grand Prix, in three divisions: open, adult amateur and junior/young rider. FEI Junior and FEI Young Rider classes have only one respective division. Freestyles have only open divisions.
