The fees listed above reflect discounts that participants in the Youth Team Championship receive automatically. The fees listed above include classes, stabling Thursday evening through the end of the show on Friday, and the competitors' picnic. All entries in the Youth Team Championship must enter one of the two competition categories above (Intro-Fourth or FEI). These reduced fees are made possible by the support of John and Janet Paxton and Paxton Farm.

NAJRYC Qualifiers: Classes YT and JT are listed in both the Youth Team Championship and in the Open show. There is only one class YT and one class JT. Classes JT and YT may be entered by participants in either the Youth Team Championship or the open show. The Youth Team Championship participation discount is given to all entrants participating on a team in the Youth Team Championship.

Competitor's picnic: All competitors are required to be present at the picnic and pre-competition meeting on Thursday at 6 PM on the show grounds. The picnic is free for all Youth Team riders. Competition procedures will be reviewed at the meeting.

The information on this page is published verbatim as required by USDF guidelines.

A rider may compete as a Junior/Young Rider until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 21.

The USDF Youth Regional Team Championships is a unique show for Youth, featuring team competition in dressage, educational programs, team medals and a mounted awards ceremony. The United States Dressage Federation (USDF) is sponsoring a championship in each region so young riders everywhere can join in the fun!

There are no qualifying scores needed to enter. A team can be 3 or 4 riders. You may enter as part of a team or as an individual, and be put on a scratch team. A team may represent a dressage club, farm, barn, instructor, Pony Club, 4-H club, any youth riding club, or be a group of individuals. Any individual or partial team needing team members is encouraged to send in their entry and a mixed team will be formed. To enter, send in the Team Competition Entry Blank.

Rules

- On the day(s) of the Youth Regional Team Championships while on the grounds (including the stabling area) the horse or pony may only be ridden by the Youth Rider(s) that will be competing that horse or pony. If the Team Championships are held in conjunction with an open competition, then on the day(s) of the Youth Team Championships the horse or pony may only be ridden by the Youth Rider(s) competing it in the Team competition.
- One whip is allowed and must be in accordance with USEF whip rules.
- Protective hardhat with chinstrap is recommended for riders.
- Horses and ponies are to be braided.
- Parents are encouraged to participate.
- Awards Ceremony: Riders will be expected to be dressed in riding clothes and mounted for the awards ceremony.

Tests

Each competitor will ride two tests in their division. Riders competing in FEI divisions will only ride one test. All tests used will be current issue.

Team Names

Have fun with this! Some examples are: Pony Power; Wild Things; The Mountsters; The Tempel Terrors.

Awards

USDF rider team medals on neck ribbons will be awarded for first through sixth place in each division. Standings will be determined by the average of each team's total score. Any division with more than six teams will be split. USDF Rosettes will be awarded to the Individual High Score Champion and Reserve in each division. **Riders will be expected to be dressed in riding clothes and mounted for the awards ceremony.**

Scoring

All scores from each team member will be counted. No scores will be dropped. Total points from each team member will be added together and divided by the number of team members to compute team placings. Three and four member teams may be in the same division.

Participation: There are no qualification requirements to enter the National Dressage Pony Cup. Any pony eligible under USEF rules is eligible to participate.

Pony classes may be pinned as a single class to six places, or may be split into any combination of Open, Adult Amateur, Pony Rider, Junior Rider, and/or Young Rider divisions with each division pinned to six places.

FEI Test-of-Choice classes may be split by test or may be pinned as a single class. FEI pony tests cannot be ridden in classes PFEI or P2FEI (enter PPT or P2PT for FEI pony tests). Great American/USDF qualification may be elected for test-of-choice classes if the test is used for Great American/USDF qualifying.

FEI Pony Test-of-Choice classes may be split by test or may be pinned as a single class. Only the preliminary, team, and individual tests may be ridden; the freestyle test may not be ridden in classes PPT or P2PT (FEI, 2FEI, or 3FEI can be entered in the open show to ride the FEI Pony Freestyle Test (open-show classes do not count toward Pony Cup awards)). Great American/USDF qualification may be elected for test-of-choice classes if the test is used for Great American/USDF qualifying.

Great American/USDF Qualifying: Q in class description means *Official Qualifying Class for the 2008 Great American/USDF Regional Championships*. Enter Q in addition to pony class and pay additional \$10 USDF fee to have score entered as Great American/USDF qualifying.

Championships: Champion and Reserve Champion are named for each level. FEI Pony TOC and FEI TOC are each considered one level. Prize to Champion and Reserve Champion. Pony/rider combinations must show in two pony-restricted classes in a level to qualify for championships. No tests, including pony tests, ridden in the open show are considered in the calculation of championships.

Open, AA (Adult Amateur), and Jr-YR (Junior/Young Rider) listed above are each separate classes; entry form must specify which class (O, A, or J) you are entering. Eligible riders may enter both O and A or O and J.

Definitions:

Q – Official Qualifying Class for the 2008 Great American/USDF Regional Championships.

AA – Open to Adult Amateurs only; competitors must compete as adults from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 22. Must hold current USEF Amateur card.

Jr-YR – Open to Juniors and Young Riders only; riders are eligible until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 21. Only Juniors ages 14-18 may enter FEI Junior Tests.

PR – Open to Pony Riders only; riders are eligible as Pony Riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 12 until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 16. Only Pony Riders may ride FEI Pony Tests.

USEF HP Qualifying Class – Qualifying class for 2008 USEF HP National Dressage Championships.

Markel/USEF Qualifier – Qualifying class for 2008 Markel/USEF Young Horse Dressage Championship Program.

NAJYRC Qualifying – Qualifying class for 2008 FEI North American Junior and Young Riders' Championships.

USEF DH Qualifier – Qualifying class for 2008 USEF National Developing Horse Dressage Championship.

Entries: Entries are accepted on a first come, first served basis and will be processed in the order received until classes are filled. Subsequent entries will be placed on a wait list and notified as times become available. Entries are made as a horse/rider combination. Illegible or incomplete entries cannot be processed until all information is provided. Completed entries with all signatures and legible copies of Coggins are to be mailed or otherwise delivered to BMCI, PO Box 248, Dexter, MI 48130, and must be RECEIVED on or before the closing date. If using express mail, waive signature. Call or email for UPS/FedEx/DHL address. A “no show” for a class will be considered a scratch for the rest of the show and times may be filled.

Faxed entries are accepted with a faxed check; this show does not accept credit cards. It is not necessary to mail the check – a bank draft will be generated from the faxed check.

Fax must include a completed, signed check as payment. Fax entry to (734) 426-3111.

Online entries are accepted at www.HorseShowOffice.com. Online entries must be paid by electronic check.

Post entries and changes are accepted, if scheduling permits, at \$10 plus normal fee per class.

Refund Policy: If an entry is cancelled prior to or on the closing date, a full refund is given less the \$25 office fee. If an entry is cancelled after the closing date, the USEF fee and any non-member fees, if paid, are refunded. No fees other than USEF fees are refundable after the closing date for any reason, including in the event of cancellation of classes due to severe weather or other emergency. Payments are applied to USEF fees after all other entry fees are paid.

Proof of membership: USEF and USDF registration is verified electronically if valid membership numbers are provided on entry form. Copies of USEF and USDF memberships, horse recordings, and HIDs **ARE NOT REQUIRED** with your entry provided you include the membership numbers on your entry form. You may be asked to provide copies if your memberships cannot be verified for any reason.

Great American/USDF Qualifying: Q in class description means *Official Qualifying Class for the 2008 Great American/USDF Regional Championships*. Enter Q in addition to Open, AA, or Jr-YR and pay additional \$10 USDF fee to have score entered as Great American/USDF qualifying. An exhibitor entered in more than one division must specify on entry form which score is to be used for the qualifying ride. FEI Pony Tests (Individual or Team) qualify for 2nd Level, FEI JR Individual qualifies for 4th Level, FEI JR Freestyle qualifies for 3rd Level Freestyle, FEI YR Freestyle qualifies for 4th Level Freestyle, Developing Horse Test qualifies for Prix St. Georges, and Young Adult Test and FEI YR GP 20-25 Test qualify for Intermediate II.

Markel/USEF Young Horse Program Qualifying: Qualifying scores can only be earned in classes US4, FEI5, and FEI6 on Sunday.

NAJYRC & USEF Qualifying: Classes JT, YT, JI, YPSG, JF, and YF are official qualifying classes for the FEI North American Junior and Young Rider Championship. Classes JT and YT are listed under both the open show and the Youth Team Championship. JT and YT are each a single class, but may be entered by both youth-team participants and non-participants. The youth-team participation discount is given only to youth-team participants (any rider eligible for JT or YT may be a youth-team participant).

USEF Developing Horse Qualifying: Class DH on Sunday is an official qualifying class for the USEF Developing Horse program.

Test-of-Choice Classes (excluding Pony Cup TOC classes): Specify test on entry. Will be split by test regardless of number of entries. Great American/USDF qualification may be elected for test-of-choice classes if the test is used for Great American/USDF qualifying and if the same test is not offered as a separate class on the same day. Test-of-choice classes do not receive ribbons and prizes as individual classes. At the end of the show, all test-of-choice rides in specific groupings are ranked by percentage and awarded ribbons through sixth place. A horse/rider combination can only be ranked once in each grouping. Contact show secretary for a complete list of groupings and each grouping's tests.

Para Equestrian Classes: Para equestrian tests that are officially designated for the standard sized, 20m x 60m arena are offered as part of the PE test-of-choice class. Para equestrian tests that specify any arena size other than 20m x 60m are not offered.

Dressage Seat Equitation: Will show at walk, trot, and canter in both directions. The rider's position, seat, and correct use and effect of aids as required by Training and First Level Dressage Tests will be judged.

Awards: Classes will be pinned and ribbons awarded to six places. Prize to first place in classes where 3 or more complete the test OR where score would qualify under GAIG/USDF requirements. In case of a tie, horses will remain tied as described in article DR123.3. Management may split classes into separate classes for Open, AA, and/or Jr-YR. No awards for qualifying classes. Test-of-choice classes are handled differently; see *Test-of-Choice Classes* above for details on TOC awards.

Combining Classes: Management reserves the right to combine Open, AA, and/or Jr-YR classes of the same test into a single class with Open, AA, and/or Jr-YR divisions. In such a case, the individual divisions may still be pinned separately to six places, or the

class may be pinned collectively to six places. (If an entrant was in both Open and AA or Open and Jr-YR and the classes are combined, the entrant will automatically be removed from the Open division. The entrant has the option of changing divisions up until one hour prior to the start of the class. In such a case, the entry fee for the dropped division's original class will be refunded.)

Championships: Champion and Reserve ribbons awarded by points as follows: 1st – 7, 2nd – 5, 3rd – 2, and 4th – 1. The horse/rider combination with the highest number of points will be Champion; the next highest will be Reserve. Must compete in a minimum of 2 classes per level/division. In case of a tie, the horse/rider combination with the highest average of scores will win. Green As Grass/Intro and Training through Fourth levels of Open, Adult Amateur, and Jr-YR Rider divisions are eligible for championships. FEI High Score Championship and Reserve ribbons awarded in Prix St. George, Intermediate I, Intermediate II, and Grand Prix B. Minimum score for FEI Champion and Reserve is 60%. Only tests specifically listed above count toward championships. USEF test-of-choice classes do not count toward championships. Youth Team Championship classes do count toward championships. Pony Cup classes do not count toward open-show championships.

USDF/Dover Adult Amateur Medal: Awarded to the Adult Amateur with the highest score in Second Level Test 3 on Friday and Sunday. To be eligible, rider must be a USDF group, participating, or intercollegiate/interscholastic member and earn a score of 58% or higher. Other requirements apply; see usdf.org.

Entry Confirmation will be emailed before the show for all entries received by the closing date. Entry must include a valid email address for entry confirmation to be mailed. Add *@HorseShowOffice.com to your approved senders to ensure you receive your confirmation; automated replies from spam blockers are not processed.

Ride Times will be emailed before the show. Include email address for rider, trainer, and/or owner on entry form to have ride times emailed. Ride times also available at www.HorseShowOffice.com. Add *@HorseShowOffice.com to your approved senders to ensure you receive your ride times.

Arenas/Footing: Five 20m x 60m competition arenas, warm-up areas, and longeing areas. All footing is sand. PVC board dressage arenas – no chain arenas. Show may elect to run some classes in short arena if test is so approved by US Equestrian.

Stabling: 302 Morton permanent stalls, 10' x 10', with doors; asphalt floor. If show becomes full, additional temporary vinyl or plastic stalls, 10' x 10', with full door may be used. Horse stalls will be given priority over tack stalls if show becomes full. No initial bedding; can purchase shavings on grounds, and shavings can be preordered on entry. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules.

I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered.

I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cablecasts, or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation.

US Equestrian Federation General Rules and Regulations

Show Management reserves the right to vary or add officials, to refuse any entry of any exhibitor for cause, to disqualify any exhibitor and/or his horse for cause, to cause an exhibitor to forfeit his winnings and ribbons for cause, to have horses removed from the grounds for cause, and to return any entry and/or stall fee before or during the show for cause, all without being liable for damage or compensation. Show management reserves the right to make any changes deemed necessary for the safe and efficient conduct of this competition.

EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT FEDERATION RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides provided the respective breed/discipline dues or breed/discipline category fee has been paid. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$20 nonmember registration fee and a \$5 breed/discipline category fee for each breed/discipline. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions; 8) Opportunity classes. 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Rule 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.
