Entries: Entries should be completed at www.HorseShowOffice.com. Alternatively, entries may be mailed or otherwise delivered to BMCI, PO Box 248, Dexter, MI 48130, and must be RECEIVED on or before the closing date. Additional \$15/show/entry fee if not entering online. No fee to enter online. If using express mail, waive signature. Call or email for UPS/FedEx address. Entries are accepted on a first come, first served basis and will be processed in the order received until classes are filled. Subsequent entries will be placed on a wait list and notified as times become available. Entries are made as a horse/rider combination. Illegible or incomplete entries cannot be processed until all information is provided. All “no shows” that have not contacted the show office will be considered a scratch for the rest of the show, are subject to a \$16 fee, and times may be filled.

Faxed entries are accepted with a faxed check, Visa, MasterCard, or Discover. **Faxed entries must include check or credit card payment.** Fax entry to (734) 426-3111.

Online entries are accepted at **www.HorseShowOffice.com**. There is NO surcharge for entering online. Online entries may be paid by check or credit card.

Post entries and changes are accepted, if scheduling permits, at \$10 plus normal fee per class. Fee for horse and/or rider change is \$25; per-class \$10 change fee applies to horse/rider changes only if classes are also changed.

Refund Policy: If an entry is cancelled prior to or on the closing date, a full refund is given less the \$25 office fee. If an entry is cancelled after the closing date, the \$16 USEF fee and any non-member fees, if paid, are refunded. No fees other than USEF fees are refundable after the closing date for any reason, including in the event of cancellation of classes due to severe weather or other emergency. Payments are applied to USEF fees after all other entry fees are paid (including the \$16 “no-show” fee if applicable).

USDF Qualifier Fee Refunds: USDF qualifier fees paid for rides that later scratch or no-show will be refunded to the competitor if the competitor has no outstanding balance.

Unpaid Charges: Any exhibitor leaving the show with an unpaid balance on an entry will be billed for the unpaid balance and a \$15/entry billing fee will be added to the total due.

Proof of membership: USEF and USDF registration is verified electronically if valid membership numbers are provided on entry form. Copies of USEF and USDF memberships, horse recordings, and HIDs **ARE NOT REQUIRED** with your entry provided you include the membership numbers on your entry form. You may be asked to provide copies if your memberships cannot be verified for any reason.

Great American/USDF Qualifying: Q in class description means *Official Qualifying Class for the 2016 Great American/USDF Regional Championships*. Enter Q in addition to Open, AA, Jr-YR, or Pony and pay additional \$10 USDF fee to have score entered as Great American/USDF qualifying. An exhibitor riding the same test in more than one class that is designated as Great American/USDF qualifying must specify on entry which score is to be used for the qualifying ride.

NAJYRC Qualifying: Classes JT, YT, JI, YI, JF, and YF are official qualifying classes for the FEI North American Junior and Young Rider Championship.

USEF Qualifying:

Classes PT and PI are official qualifiers for 2016 USEF Pony Rider National Championship, Classes JT, YT, JI, and YI are official qualifiers for 2016 AGCO/USEF Junior and Young Rider Dressage National Championships,
Class BC is an official qualifier for 2016 USEF Young Adult ‘Brentina Cup’ Dressage National Championship presented by *Dressage Today*, and

Classes US4, FEI5, FEI6, DHP, and DHG are official qualifiers for 2016 Markel/USEF Young and Developing Horse Dressage Championships.

Test-of-Choice Classes: Specify test on entry. Great American/USDF qualification may be elected for Intermediate Freestyle or Grand Prix Freestyle in class 1FFS and/or 3FFS (use non-TOC class to qualify at I1 or GP freestyle on Saturday) and for FEI Junior Team Test or Young Rider Team Test in class 2F1 and/or 3F1 (use non-TOC class to qualify at JT or YT on Friday). For USEF and FEI TOC, if not specified otherwise in entry, the first TOC test listed will be entered in the first applicable TOC class; the second TOC test, in the second applicable TOC class; the third (if applicable), in the third TOC class.

Para Equestrian Classes: Para equestrian tests will be held in the size arena specified on the test. Para Equestrian Dressage National Championship Freestyle classes will be held in 20m x 60m arenas. Para Equestrian Dressage National Championship Grade III & IV classes will be held in 20m x 60m arenas. USEF and Para Dispensation Cards must be submitted with entry.

Dressage Seat Equitation: Will show at walk, trot, and canter i

n both directions. The rider's position, seat, and correct use and effect of aids as required by Training and First Level Dressage Tests will be judged.

Awards: Classes will be pinned and ribbons awarded to six places. Prize to first place in classes where 3 or more complete the test OR where score would qualify under GAIG/USDF requirements. In case of a tie, horses will remain tied as described in article DR123.3. Management may split classes into separate classes for Open, AA, and/or Jr-YR.

Combining Classes: Management reserves the right to combine Open, AA, Jr-YR, and/or Pony classes of the same test into a single class with Open, AA, Jr-YR, and/or Pony divisions. In such a case, the individual divisions may still be pinned separately to six places, or the class may be pinned collectively to six places. (If an entrant was in divisions and the classes are combined, the entrant will automatically be placed in the most restrictive division. The entrant has the option of changing divisions up until one hour prior to the start of the class. In such a case, the entry fee for the dropped division's original class will be refunded.)

Championships: In determining championships, *Spring Classic I & II*, *June I & II*, and *Summer Finale I & II* each count as one show. Champion and Reserve ribbons awarded by points as follows: 1st – 7, 2nd – 5, 3rd – 2, and 4th – 1. The horse/rider combination with the highest number of points will be Champion; the next highest will be Reserve. Must compete in a minimum of 2 classes per level/division. In case of a tie, the horse/rider combination with the highest average of scores will win. Intro, Opportunity, and Training through Fourth levels of Open, Adult Amateur, and Jr-YR Rider divisions are eligible for championships. FEI High Score Championship and Reserve ribbons awarded in Prix St. George, Intermediate I, Intermediate II, and Grand Prix. Minimum score for FEI Champion and Reserve is 60%. Only tests specifically listed above count toward championships. USEF test-of-choice classes do not count toward championships. Opportunity classes count only toward the Opportunity Championship.

Series Grand Championships: Series Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion neck sash ribbons awarded for Intro, Training through Fourth levels of Open, AA, and Jr-YR, Prix St. Georges, Intermediate I, Intermediate II, and Grand Prix. Detailed specifications for determination of Series Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion will be available online prior to the show. Grand Championship award ceremonies will be held at *Dressage at Waterloo Autumn Classic*. Opportunity classes do not count toward series grand championships.

USDF/Dover Adult Amateur Medal: Awarded to the Adult Amateur with the highest score in Second Level Test 3 on Friday and Sunday. To be eligible, rider must be a USDF group or participating member and earn a score of 60% or higher. Other requirements apply; see usdf.org.

National Pony Cup TOC Class: Class 2PC on Saturday is designated for qualification for the National Dressage Pony Cup. Class is restricted to ponies (measurement card must be submitted with entry, or a measurement must be scheduled with the show secretary). Test options are limited to USDF Intro, USEF Training through Fourth levels, FEI Prix St. Georges, Intermediate I, Intermediate II, and Grand Prix. Cannot ride young horse, developing horse, freestyle, rider, para equestrian, or eventing tests in class 2PC. Also cannot ride any FEI test other than the four tests listed above (PSG, I1, I2, and GP).

National Pony Cup Series Award: To be eligible for NDPC Dressage at Waterloo Pony Series Awards, the same pony/rider combination must participate in at least three out of the five NDPC Partner Shows (Waterloo Spring Classic I & II, Waterloo June I & II, Waterloo July, Waterloo August, and Waterloo Summer Finale) in any pony *only* class. Test options are limited to USDF Intro, USEF Training through Fourth levels, FEI Prix St. Georges, Intermediate I, Intermediate II, Grand Prix and FEI Pony Tests. Champion and Reserve Champion will be awarded in each division (Open, AA, Jr/YR). USEF Pony Measurement card required. The scores will have a degree of difficulty added in based on the level and test performed; the scores will then be averaged to calculate the winners. See www.dressageponycup.com for degree of difficulty chart. Awards will be mailed concluding the final partner show.

Ransom Memorial Equitation Trophy: The first three places in Jr-YR Rider Equitation at each *Dressage at Waterloo* show through and including *Dressage at Waterloo Autumn Classic* qualify to ride in the Equitation Championship at *Dressage at Waterloo Autumn Classic*. The winner of the championship class will be this year's winner of the *Ransom Memorial Equitation Trophy*. Sponsored by Carolyn Van Cise.

Entry Confirmation will be emailed before the show for all entries received by the closing date. Entry must include a valid email address for entry confirmation to be mailed. Add *@HorseShowOffice.com to your approved senders to ensure you receive your confirmation; automated replies from spam blockers are not processed.

Ride Times will be emailed before the show. Include email address for rider, trainer, and/or owner on entry form to have ride times emailed. Ride times also available at www.HorseShowOffice.com. Add *@HorseShowOffice.com to your approved senders to ensure you receive your ride times.

Arenas/Footing: Five 20m x 60m competition arenas; three full sized warm up areas – all-weather sand. Separate lunging areas. PVC board dressage arenas – no chain arenas. Show may elect to run some classes in short arena if test is so approved by USEF.

Stabling: Permanent wooden stalls, 10' x 10' with half doors or temporary vinyl stalls with full door. Horse stalls will be given priority over tack stalls if show becomes full. No initial bedding; can purchase shavings on grounds. If you are bringing a stallion you **MUST** pay for a tack stall to separate other horses. In "stable with" requests, use a name common to all in your group. **NO SMOKING IN STABLING AREAS.**

Para Equestrian Championship Stabling: Restricted to horses and exhibitors entered in the USEF Para Equestrian National Championship/USEF Para Selection Trials – security included. Earliest arrival time is 10:00 AM Wednesday. No riding before 1:00 PM Wednesday.

Coggins Test: Every horse must have on file with the show office a negative Coggins test taken no earlier than 12 months prior to the end of the show.

Official Prize List – register for prize list updates at HorseShowOffice.com

Proof of Vaccination: Every horse must have on file with the show office documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhino pneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering stables. For vaccines administered by veterinarian: documentation should be provided by veterinarian and include name of horse, name of vaccines, date of vaccine administration. For vaccines administered by person other than veterinarian: documentation should include a receipt of vaccine purchase signed by owner; horse name, serial number and expiration date of vaccine and date of vaccine administration. See **GR845 Equine Vaccination Rule**.

Medical Waste: Sharps containers are located at the end of each barn (and attached to tent poles around the outside of tents in the case of tent stabling). Per USEF rules, competition management may fine any individuals, including trainers, owners, exhibitors, and their agents, up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.

Freestyle Music: CDs must be clearly labeled with entry number and music directives, delivered to the show office two hours before the class starts, and picked up following the class. Unclaimed CDs will not be mailed. You may designate an assistant to direct the playing of your music. Sound checks are available Thursday evening after 6:00 PM or Friday or Saturday afternoon during the lunch break. Other times available by request; please request your sound check when you check in.

Pony Measurement: Ponies entered in any pony division or in FEI Pony Tests and in need of USEF measurement cards must make an appointment for measuring with show management prior to the show. The official measurement session will be scheduled on the Thursday before the show. Owners of ponies needing measurement will be charged a fee not to exceed \$100 to cover the fee charged by the official veterinarian required for the measurement.

Camping: Any electrical or water hook-up to a trailer or other vehicle constitutes camping and will incur camping hook-up fees. Camping without hook-up is available at the front camper pad only.

Restrooms: Permanent restroom facilities with showers on grounds.

Entertainment: Exhibitor party Saturday evening. Food service on grounds. Retail trade concessions also available. Contact Show Manager for information on concession space and program advertising.

Directions: From I-94, exit No. 150 (Grass Lake). Turn North and then turn right on Glenn Road (third road). Waterloo Hunt is on the left in approximately one mile. Show grounds are at the back of the property.

Farrier: on grounds.

Dogs must remain leashed and under control at all times.

Parking: Permitted in assigned areas only. Fire lanes must be kept open.

Selection Event for the Rio 2016 Paralympic Games Procedures and Information

Athletes qualified for the Selection Event (the “Event”) for the Rio 2016 Paralympic Games are by invitation only for those who have qualified per the 2016 Paralympic Selection Criteria including athletes who have received waivers from the Selectors for all or part of the Selection Criteria.

The Event will be conducted in accordance with the USEF Dressage/Para Equestrian Rules and the 2016 Paralympic Selection criteria effective at the time of the Selection Trials, except the FEI Para Equestrian Dressage rules regarding saddlery, dress, and schooling will supersede USEF rules. USEF GR 409 is the governing Drugs & Medications rules for this Event. As such, the FEI Prohibited Substances list must be strictly adhered to. Please be reminded that athletes in the out-of-competition testing pool are subject to out of competition testing. The Prohibited Substance List can be found HERE. The USEF Dressage rules and Paralympic Selection Criteria can be found at https://www.usef.org/_IFrames/breedsdisciplines/discipline/allparaquestrian/hpparaEquestrian.aspx

Soundness: All horses will be examined for soundness at the start of the Event in accordance with Article 1033, III., IV., V., and VI of the FEI 2015 Veterinary Regulations, 13th Edition 2014, effective January 1, 2015.

All athlete/horse combinations invited to the Event must be on the competition grounds one hour prior to the Veterinary Inspection. All horses must remain on competition grounds from the time that they arrive on the competition grounds until the completion of the Event. Exception: Removal of any horse will only be permitted for emergency veterinarian care or observation with the approval of the Team Veterinarian (or, in absence of the Team Veterinarian, a member of the Veterinarian Panel). All USEF Dressage Rules will be enforced while horses are on competition grounds. All horses in the Selection Trial must adhere to the FEI Equine Anti-Doping & Controlled Medication Regulations as outlined in Section I.E.1 from the start of the Veterinary Inspection through the conclusion of the Selection Trial; including any non-competition days.

No athlete may compete more than two (2) horses at the Event.

Ranking

50% of the USEF Ranking is based on the following formula:

- 25% 1st highest CPEDI3* (weighted scores 40/40/20)
- 25% 2nd highest CPEDI3* (weighted scores 40/40/20)

The two CPEDI3* scores will be combined and they will total 50% of the overall Ranking score.

All athlete/horse combinations must complete the FEI Individual Championship Test, FEI Team Test, and FEI Musical Freestyle at the Event. The athlete/horse combinations will be ranked based on their overall performance at the Event, by weighting the FEI Para-Equestrian Dressage test scores from the Selection Trial as follows (50% of Final Ranking):

- Individual Championship Test = 40%
- Team Test = 40%
- Musical Freestyle Test = 20%

If there is a tie in the Final Ranking of the Event, the tie will be broken based upon the highest score earned by the athlete/horse combination in the Individual Championship Test at the Event. If a tie remains thereafter, it will be broken based upon the highest test score earned by the athlete/horse combination in the Team Test of the Selection Trial. If a tie still remains thereafter, it will be broken based upon the Musical Freestyle Test score awarded by the president of the Ground Jury to the horse/athlete combination in the Event. If a tie still remains thereafter it will be broken based on the majority vote of the Selectors (see Section II.C.2. of the 2016 Paralympic Dressage Selection Criteria).

USEF Para Dressage National Championships Sponsored by Deloitte Procedures and Information

The USEF Para Dressage National Championships Sponsored by Deloitte will consist of two divisions, High Performance Division and National Division. Each division will compete against athletes within their respective division. An Athlete/horse combination may enter only one of the two divisions. However, if an athlete enters two horses, each horse may compete in either division, as qualified. No athlete may compete more than two (2) horses at the Championships.

Criteria to determine Eligibility to compete in the 2016 Para Dressage National Championships may be found at

Separate awards will be given for each division.

Athletes must compete at the Grade for which they are qualified. In the event an athlete's classification changes during the qualification period prior to the Event, athlete must requalify at the new Grade.

The High Performance and National Division will be conducted in accordance with the USEF Dressage Rules effective at the time of the Championships, except the FEI Para-Equestrian Regulations regarding saddlery, dress, and schooling will supersede USEF rules. The USEF Dressage Rules can be found at www.usef.org; the FEI Para-Equestrian Regulations for Equestrian Events which can be found at www.fei.org.

All athlete/horse combinations invited to the National Championships must be on the competition grounds of the Championships one hour prior to the Veterinary Inspection. All horses must remain on competition grounds from the time that they arrive on the competition grounds until the completion of the Championships. Exception: Removal of any horse will only be permitted for emergency veterinarian care or observation. All USEF Dressage Rules will be enforced while horses are on competition grounds.

Awards

Award ceremonies will be unmounted.

Ribbons to 6th place will be awarded for every class. Overall Champion and Reserve Champion for each division (National and High Performance) will all receive a ribbon and cooler. One ride each day will count for both the Selection Trial awards and the USEF Para Dressage National Championships Sponsored by Deloitte awards. Overall Champion and Reserve Champion for each division (National and High Performance) will be tabulated across all three days (athletes must compete in all three classes of their Grade to qualify for Overall awards) according to the formula 40% Team test, 40% Individual test and 20% Freestyle.

Lloyd Landkamer Memorial Para Dressage Sportsmanship Trophy

The Lloyd Landkamer Memorial Sportsmanship Trophy is to be awarded annually to the Para-Dressage Athlete competing at the USEF Para Dressage National Championship who best personifies the high standards and virtues of integrity, sportsmanship, honor, courage, team spirit, good temper and unselfishness.

How selected:

The organizing committee and officials of the competition shall nominate up to three competitors exemplifying the award definition the day before the final awards ceremony. The athletes participating in the event shall vote for the winner (one vote per athlete) once the slate has been announced. The winner shall be presented the award during the final awards ceremony.

The trophy:

The Perpetual Trophy will be engraved with the annual winner's plate and maintained by the USEF. A take-home trophy will be given to the recipient of this coveted award.

I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules.

I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered.

I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cablecasts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation.

The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR1502.5.

US Equestrian Federation General Rules and Regulations

Show Management reserves the right to vary or add officials, to refuse any entry of any exhibitor for cause, to disqualify any exhibitor and/or his horse for cause, to cause an exhibitor to forfeit his winnings and ribbons for cause, to have horses removed from the grounds for cause, and to return any entry and/or stall fee before or during the show for cause, all without being liable for damage or compensation. Show management reserves the right to make any changes deemed necessary for the safe and efficient conduct of this competition.

EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT FEDERATION RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$30 nonmember registration fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.
